ADHD frequently occurs alongside other conditions (comorbidities) such as anxiety, autism, depression, dyslexia, dyspraxia, epilepsy, sensory processing disorder, Tourettes syndrome and especially in cases of untreated ADHD or late diagnosis - oppositional defiant disorder (ODD) People with ADHD may also have additional problems such as sleep
